Mr. Ted Henifin,
General Manager, HRSD



Ted Henifin joined Hampton Roads Sanitation District (HRSD) on November 1, 2006, as General Manager. He previously served for nine years as Director of Public Works for the City of Hampton, Va. He has served as a senior engineer with the Norfolk Redevelopment and Housing Authority and deputy site manager of the Navy Public Works Center Site at Little Creek.

He is a registered professional engineer and currently is a board member of the National Association of Clean Water Agencies, and President of the Virginia Association of Municipal Wastewater Agencies. He is president of the George Wythe Recreation Association, Chairman of the American Red Cross, Hampton Roads Chapter, and serves on the board of the Hampton Neighborhood Development Partnership and is a past president of the Downtown Hampton Child Development Center.

Mr. Henifin holds a BS in civil engineering from the University of Virginia.

JoAnn Meaker was born in Brooklyn, raised on Long Island, and spent almost 30 years in the town of Ontario, just east of Rochester, New York, before relocating to Glen Allen, Virginia in 2010.

During her life, she has held many leadership positions beginning with Leader Corps in high school. She was a den leader coach for cub scouts, served on the board of AGATE, a statewide education organization, was the lead teacher for her district's gifted education department; has served as the president of her former town's historical society (which owns and operates a nine-building historical museum); has been the past president of the Hanover County Rotary Club, and now serves as Area 1 Assistant Governor. JoAnn also serves as the District 7600 Public Image Coordinator and has recently helped redesign the District Rotary web page.

A retired teacher of gifted and talented students she is now actively involved in her "second career" as a writer. She's written six books, a collection of short stories (A Line of Shorts), a children's fantasy book (Nola's Gift) and the newly published nonfiction (Stories Beneath the Stones: Richmond National Cemetery). In addition she's written articles for newspapers and her writing has appeared in several anthologies. She is the current president of the Hanover Writers Club and is on the board of the Virginia Writers Club.

Mr. S. Frear Hawkins



Mr. Frear Hawkins passed away at home on Thursday, September 21 following his courageous battle with a serious health issue. He was born in Newport News, VA on February 22, 1941, but spent most of his life in Hampton. He was preceded in death by his parents, Stuart and Maude Hawkins, infant brother Lawrence Adrian, sisters Lynn H. Gazaniga, and Leslie H. Damasceno. He is survived by his wife Carolyn Haldeman Hawkins, daughter, Jennifer H. Conner and her husband Eric of Virginia Beach, son Stuart F. Hawkins, III of Hampton, sister, Alix H. Fortson of Seattle and several nieces and nephews. Frear was a 1959 graduate of Hampton High School. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Virginia in 1964, and a Bachelor of Laws from UVA in 1967. He began his practice of law in Hampton as an assistant city attorney (1967-71). In 1972, he became partner in the Moore and Hawkins law firm. He was a partner in several Hampton law firms during his career, the last being Hawkins, Burcher & Boester, P.C. In July 2017, he received a certificate of appreciation from the Virginia State Bar commemorating more than 50 years of service to the Commonwealth of Virginia. In addition, he was a Substitute Judge in the Hampton General District Court, a Commissioner in Chancery, for the 8th Judicial District, and a member of the Peninsula Ports Authority of Virginia. (1988-1996) A long-time member of the Hampton Rotary Club, he served as President (1977-8). He was a faithful member of St. John's Episcopal Church.

Frear enjoyed racing Hampton One Design sailboats for many years and later became a crew member on a larger ocean going sailboat named "Tramp". A long-time member of the Hampton Yacht Club, he served as a Commodore in 1985 and in 2014 received an Honorary Membership for rendering outstanding service to the Club. He had many friends, but especially enjoyed playing a game of golf while verbally sparring with his companions.

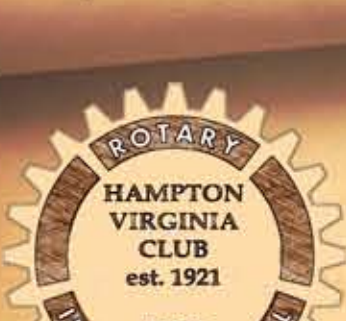
